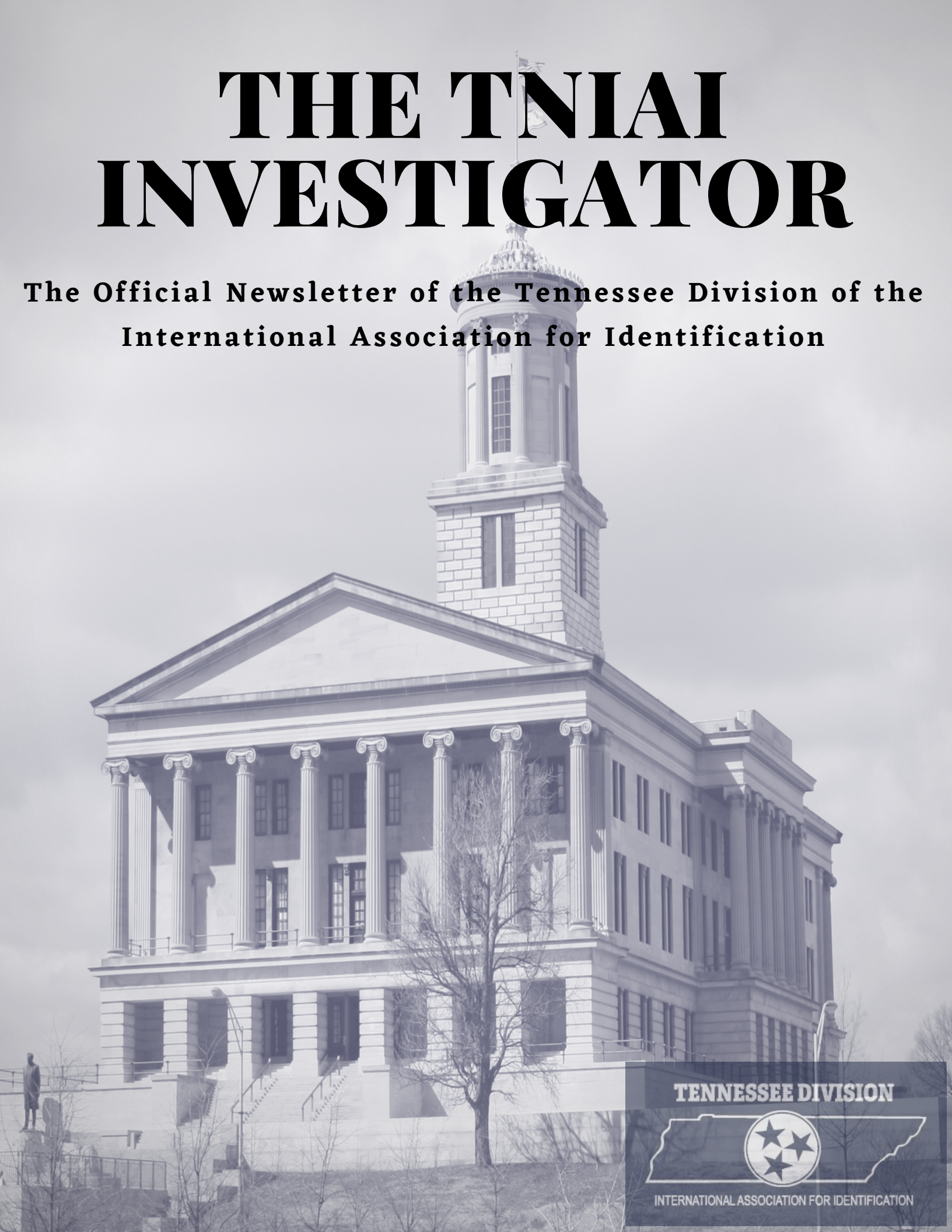

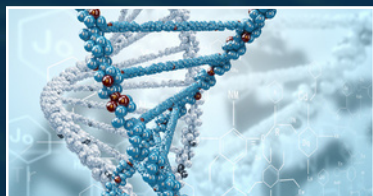

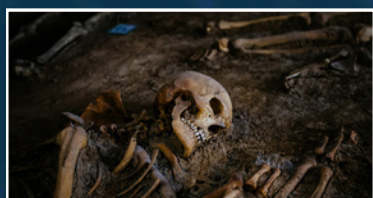

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

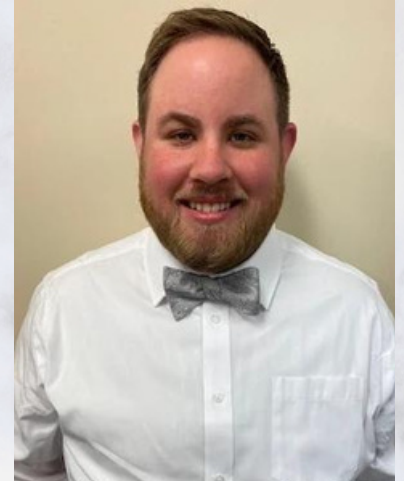


Message from the President
